



## Commissioners Seek Volunteers for Special Use Permit Board

TRENTON, Ga. (Nov. 6, 2025) — The Dade County Board of Commissioners is seeking community-minded residents to serve on the county’s Special Use Permit Board, a volunteer body that reviews applications and makes recommendations to the Commission for projects requiring special land-use consideration.

During the November workshop, Commissioners discussed Resolutions R-41-25 and R-42-25, which address open appointments for Districts 3 and 4. The Special Use Permit Board was established to evaluate projects such as industrial uses and other developments that fall outside ordinary land-use categories.

Commissioner Bob Woods and Commissioner Melissa Bradford both encouraged citizens to consider serving. “We need people who are willing to step up and be part of this process,” Woods said. Bradford added that volunteers provide valuable perspective when evaluating projects that can shape the future of the county.

Chairman Don Townsend echoed those comments, noting that the board plays a key advisory role. “If you are interested in helping guide Dade County’s growth, please reach out to one of the Commissioners or to our administrative office,” Townsend said.
