



Dade County Commission Declares Two County Assets Surplus for Public Sale

TRENTON, Ga. (Dec. 4, 2025) — The Dade County Board of Commissioners approved the disposal of two surplus county assets during its December regular meeting, authorizing the public sale of an aging vehicle and a fire apparatus no longer needed for county operations.

Through **Resolution R-52-25**, commissioners declared a **2002 Ford F-150 pickup truck** surplus to county needs. In a separate action, the board adopted **Resolution R-53-25**, declaring **Engine 41**, a **1993 International fire engine**, surplus to service.

Both items will be offered for sale through **GovDeals**, the county's online auction platform used to ensure transparency and competitive bidding in the disposal of surplus property.

County officials routinely evaluate vehicles and equipment to determine when assets have reached the end of their useful life or can be replaced with more efficient or reliable options. Declaring surplus property allows the county to responsibly manage its inventory while recovering value that may be redirected toward current operational priorities.

The resolutions were approved unanimously as part of the board's regular business.
